


























Because there was nobody that could care for me I was taken in by the orphanage, I spent my childhood there.




When I left the orphanage the institution didn't pass on my official documents that proved I am from Kenya...

I am worried, people think badly of me because I grew up in an orphanage.








Without these pieces of paper it is not possible for me to access public services like the e-citizen service, or to find a good job that is secure.


I was forced to work as a cleaner, but my employers treated me very badly. I had to run away, to escape them.












